

The East Hants Community Rider was originally established to breakdown one of the biggest barriers to education - transportation. For many years, the Community Rider has helped take adult learners to class, and has since evolved to taking community members to educational programs, work, social outings, personal errands, sight seeing, holiday outings, medical appointments and to spend time with loved ones.

In the fall of 2017, EHCR launched shopping trips to Mic Mac Mall and Masstown Market, which enabled our community to enjoy social outings (and shop!).

With such a successful year, our fleet needed an upgrade. Thanks to a generous donation from Elmsdale Lumber Company, we were able to purchase "Tom Cruze", and retire "Rosie Rider" from the roads. ### **OUR ADULT LEARNING PROGRAMS**

EHCLA Adult Learning Programs (ALP) and Basic Computer classes were offered in Elmsdale, Shubenacadie, and Fall River. Often, learners in our programs explicitly identify preparation for the GED test as their goal. Our dedicated GED preparation classes offer individualized instruction in a welcoming and supportive environment.

At EHCLA, we also offer instruction in the Orton-Gillingham method of tutoring. This explicit, multisensory instruction in reading and spelling is designed to help dyslexic learners improve their decoding, writing and comprehension skills.

ALP programs are designed to help learners improve literacy, math and essential skills. Throughout the

year, we also offer opportunities to participate in additional activities that broaden learners' experience, support learning, build employability and social skills and get them ready for work in the community.

We've had a packed year, with students learning how to create healthy soup lunches as part of our nutrition program, bonding over a bowling tournament with Colchester Adult Learning Association, visiting the Body Worlds Exhibit, discovering their strengths with Strength Finders, and exploring the Discovery Centre.







#### **COMPUTER CLASSES**

EHCLA's computer classes offer instruction in basic computer applications, such as tablet, iPad and smart phone skills, email, social media and word processing. These classes are customized to the group of learners attending. Learners can be seniors or adults and classes are offered both daytime and evening. Our newest team member, Tom Richard, leads this program.

### **FAMILY LITERACY**

EHCLA's Family Literacy Program is a very important component of our programs. Through this stream we offer several Alphabet Soup in Motion programs which are designed for 3 year olds and their caregiver. In this positive parenting program families read, rhyme, sing, eat healthy snacks, and play.

We celebrate Family Literacy Day in January and host an annual Kick off Summer Family Picnic for the whole community in June where we encourage all ages to read for fun. This past year we offered a Write Your Family Story workshop which included a free family photo shoot.
