

A MESSAGE FROM OUR COMMUNITY RIDER TEAM

This year, the East Hants & Area Community Rider has continued to deliver on its important commitment to the community: affordable, accessible, door-to-door transportation for all. Our team at the Community Rider office is working hard to break down barriers and help as many people as possible.

Our service was originally established to get learners to class. Over the years, EHCR has developed into a service for the whole community: taking passengers to classes, employment, training, workshops, medical appointments, social outings, sightseeing and holiday visits. This is just a sampling: we take folks of a wide range of destinations.

We are happy to tell you that our service has been growing. In 2018-2019, the East Hants & Area Community Rider had a total of 318 passengers – 44 more people than last year! We delivered 11,418 rides this year and travelled 415,965 kilometers. This reflects an overall increase of 17% in service delivery.

These numbers will continue to grow, as we are expanding our service into the Fall River and Waverley areas. To help us service these regions, we are hiring more drivers.

The Fleet Lead Coordinator role that we implemented last year has proven to streamline our vehicle maintenance, resulting in less downtime for vehicle repairs and has created efficiency in maintenance costs.

In Fall 2018, EHCR launched another round of shopping trips to Mic Mac Mall and Masstown Market. With the help of a poverty reduction grant, we were able to offer \$2 shopping loops, which were a hit with our passengers. This funding also covered financial subsidies for those who needed it most.

We look forward to this new chapter of EHCR. In 2019-2020, we will continue to increase our presence in the community, including finding community support for even more vehicles on the road. We are all in this together and through corporate members and donations, we will be able to help even more people.

OUR ADULT LEARNING PROGRAMS

At the heart of EHCLA are our Adult Learning Programs (ALPs), Computer Classes and Family Literacy. These offer the core skills that learners need to update their education, keep pace with today's technology and learn together as families. We had 320 registrations across these programs this year!






